Encounter stories of the Revolutionary War on the Western front—how did this national event impact those living in Spanish and French territory? This summer, meet with various characters from Missouri's side of the conflict and learn about colonial lifeways in our region. Each month will feature different storytellers and crafts, on the second Thursday of each month, June through August. Presented in partnership with the St. Charles County Historical Society, this event is free and open to guests of all ages. Kids can even complete a scavenger hunt for a special prize! SESSION TOPICS:

JUNE: Visit with the Spanish militia, learn about the Chickasaw Nation, hear stories from the Battle of St. Louis, and watch craftspeople create band boxes. Enjoy traditional music and experience other historic lifeways during your visit to the Boone Home.

JULY: Meet Jeanette Forchet, a free Black woman who witnessed the Revolution in St. Louis. Listen to stories about the Boone family's involvement during the Revolutionary period. Visit with members of the Spanish militia and soldiers from George Rogers Clark's army.

AUGUST: Explore life after the Revolutionary War and hear stories of the people who made their home in Missouri. Learn about changes to slavery under the newly formed United States government, discover the travels of Meriwether Lewis and William Clark, and encounter the waves of German immigrants who made their new home in Missouri.
